

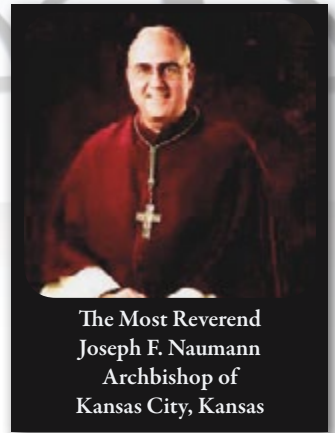
# LCCIP

The goal of the Language, Culture and Church Program for International Priests (LCCIP) at Conception Seminary College (CSC) is to provide opportunities for the international priest to better understand and to be better understood in his service to the American Catholic Church.

This is carried out through a four-week program of morning sessions centered on accent reduction and American English language development and afternoon



workshops centered on the sacramental ministry of a priest to cover the many and varied aspects of priestly life in the United States.

Participants will also receive VIRTUS training, if needed, for working with youth.



LCCIP participants come from a variety of different countries and receive the benefit of small class sizes catered to specific areas of focus and the opportunity to put what they've learned into practice.

*Afternoon workshops are devoted to the following topics:*

**The Sacraments of Christian Initiation**

- Infant Baptism, Confirmation & the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults
- Youth Ministry
- Catechetics

**The Sacrament of Matrimony**

- Pastoral Preparation of Couples
- Canonical Issues (annulments, divorce, etc.)
- Marriage Counseling

**The Sacrament of the Eucharist**

- General Instruction of the Roman Missal and American Adaptations
- Liturgical Preaching
- Music in the Liturgy

Staff is drawn from the CSC faculty and priests of local dioceses. Participants will be free for weekend supply in their home dioceses or for excursions to the local areas of interest. Each participant will take his turn as principal celebrant and homilist at daily Eucharists which will be videographed and critiqued with him. Participants will also have the opportunity for prayer and recreation with the resident Benedictine community of Conception Abbey.

The sponsoring diocese will help identify areas of needed attention and will receive an evaluation from the LCCIP director for each of their priests soon after the session ends.

The dates for the summer 2012 program are Monday, 2 July at noon until Friday, 27 July, after lunch.
